Be a Part of SCAD's Championship Legacy

For more than 45 years, SCAD has prepared the superstars of the creative stage—the **changemakers** and visionaries revolutionizing art, design, fashion, film, and more. This legacy of success has extended into the art of competition, with many SCAD athletics teams establishing a championship pedigree throughout the university's history.

Today, SCAD is proud to announce the transformative next step for two of the university's most accomplished athletics teams. A new, state-of-the-art SCAD Athletic Complex dedicated to the university's lacrosse and soccer teams will help our artist-athletes to continue competing at the highest level, elevate our athletics programs, and contribute to the overall growth and success of our university.

The SCAD lacrosse and soccer teams are among the most decorated at SCAD, earning consistent top 20 rankings and challenging for conference and NAIA national titles. The SCAD women's soccer team followed up winning the program's first-ever The Sun Conference regular season and tournament titles in 2023 with a historic treble in 2024: repeating as the conference's **regular season and tournament champions** and capping their season with their **first NAIA National Championship**. The SCAD men's team also had a standout season, finishing second in The Sun Conference and reaching its **tournament title game**. The SCAD women's lacrosse team is one of the most successful in the NAIA, with frequent top-five rankings and **six national championships** in its history, while the SCAD men's lacrosse team experienced a resurgent 2024 campaign, completing its first full **winning season** since 2019. Additionally, SCAD co-hosted the NAIA Men's and Women's National Championship in 2024 and 2025 at Savannah's Memorial Stadium.

In addition to these team accolades, **SCAD artist-athletes frequently receive conference and national honors**. Each team has also had multiple NAIA All-Americans and dozens of NAIA Daktronics Scholar-Athlete Honors, reflecting their success on the playing field and in the classroom. These accomplishments underscore SCAD's dedication to excellence in both academics and athletics, demonstrating the **caliber of talent and commitment** within the SCAD community.

The new SCAD Athletic Complex will bring much needed locker rooms and an athletic training space to the university's existing sports fields north of Savannah. Beyond the immediate benefits to our athletes, these new facilities will **magnify the university's ability to host conference and national tournaments**, showcasing the prowess of our athletics teams and **bringing national attention to SCAD and the Savannah region**. In addition to enhancing our teams' competitive edge, these improvements will significantly raise our recruitment efforts. The facility will serve as **a beacon for prospective student-athletes**, illustrating our commitment to providing top-notch resources for their athletic and academic pursuits.

As we embark on this ambitious project, we are reaching out to our esteemed alumni and dedicated donors to join us in raising \$3.5 million in order to make this athletic complex a reality. **Your support will make a lasting impact** on the growth and success of future SCAD artist-athletes and propel SCAD to new heights of collegiate athletics excellence. A NEW ERA

The new athletic complex at the SCAD lacrosse and soccer fields offers both immediate and longterm benefits to the university's athletics teams:

Improved care: The current lacrosse and soccer fields have no on-site locker room or athletic training spaces, meaning athletes must travel back to their residences or other university buildings to shower and receive training services. In the new athletic complex, SCAD artist-athletes will have on-site access to these amenities and more, including a meeting space to help foster a sense of community among team members. These state-of-the-art new facilities will raise the profile of the SCAD artist-athlete experience, increasing each team's ability to recruit new athletes.

Impactful usage: SCAD teams are at the athletic fields five to six days per week based on practice and game schedules; four daily practices totaling eight hours per day are common when team schedules overlap. The complex would be used consistently throughout the year, and expanded facilities offer the opportunity to host more events, including regional and national tournaments and other exhibitions.

Regular events: In addition to each team's regular season schedule, SCAD has previously hosted The Sun Conference Tournament games and opening rounds of the 2023 and 2024 NAIA Women's Soccer National Championship. In 2024 and 2025, SCAD hosted the NAIA Men's and Women's Lacrosse National Championships at Savannah's Memorial Stadium, in part due to the lack of locker rooms and athletic training space at the current athletic complex. As part of these regular season games and postseason tournaments, teams from Miami to Maine and the East Coast to the state of Washington have visited Savannah for competitions. While some tournament sites are chosen based on team rankings, the new athletic complex would allow SCAD to apply to host more of these events.

Increased attendance: In 2023-24, SCAD hosted approximately 50 home games for its lacrosse and soccer teams. Including players and fans for both teams, these events can bring in a minimum of 200 people per game, or more than 10,000 visitors each academic year. The new athletic complex would help support these visitors on game day and position the university to increase its events calendar.









With the investment in the SCAD athletic complex, SCAD will be able to provide a state-of-the-art facility for our artist-athletes just like we do for their education. It is a relief to me as a coach that my players would no longer have to worry about little things that impact their experience—needing to store equipment in their cars, changing in the parking lot, being able to shower before class, and being able to launder their uniforms on-site. I also think about the impact and impression a state-of-the-art facility will leave on every guest we have, from recruits and families to our opponents. I look forward to the day when not only will our artist-athletes have a place to call home, but most importantly, have an incredible place to compete in front of their family and friends."








AT A GLANCE

- Minimum of 16,000 total square feet
- Four home team locker rooms and two visiting team locker rooms equipped with bathroom facilities and showers
- Referee room equipped with shower
- 800 sq. ft. team meeting space
- On-site athletic training, laundry, and equipment storage space
- Approximately 50 on-site parking spaces
